
A Love Story

Fully furnished (with same model, even)




Except for the addition of a bookcase Steve made with boards and concrete blocks.

And the first party they hosted...




The first climb up Mount Mansfield

The first smooching selfie (way ahead of their time)




And the results of too much smooching (otherwise known as "koo koo stuff")

And leave his sweetheart in Webster Groves at her parents' house.




But the Navy let Steve come home for a weekend to see his new "Cathy"

When Steve wasn't busy playing a SeaBee,






They visited California sights like Universal Studios

And Devil's Postpile National Memorial




And Sequoia National Park

Then it was off to Guam.




They took up residence in Navy housing

Wasn't long before Steve had his wisdom teeth taken out (and it appears Cathy did, too?)




But that's okay because he got to dress as his favorite hero, the Lone Ranger, with trusted Tonto by his side.




Cathy grew to look more like her mom -- sometimes.

Thanksgiving was shared with their "out-of-town" friends at Essex Alliance Church.




The winter of 1978 brought plenty snow.


Cathy watches Dad goof off in it.

In 1980, the family took a trip back Webster Groves to visit the high school where they met.




And on the way home, they stopped by Niagra Falls.




The next Spring in Vermont, it was time for "sugar on snow".

1983 anniversary celebration at Mountain Top Inn




A photo in Fairfax shows how they're growing up.

Steve sings...




Steve rides...




Cathy heads off to her freshman year at Gordon and introduces her parents to a boy she met.

Cathy reaches 1000 points.




Jeff, now at Gordon, chooses among his admirers.

July 1994, Steve celebrates 25 years with IBM.




Cathy and Eric announce their December wedding




As Steve and Pat were on their way to the 1994 Samuels Family Reunion in Outer Banks.

And Easter in Vermont:




Pat joins Steve on a business trip to Nashville.




Then in December, celebrates her 50th birthday!

Then heads off to Oklahoma to complete the missing link of his cross-country bike trip.




1997 was also the year of the 3rd Samuels Family Reunion at the Outer Banks.

Spring of 2001, the lovers go to Paris!






Cathy and Eric have another announcement...

And without




They traveled the country showing them off, in Springfield, IL:

It wasn't long before Alison and Jeff had an announcement of their own.




January 29, 2003, welcome Otto!

As did the other boys...




Nana and Pop stop to reflect on their journey through life. In love with each other and depending on God, they look forward to what the future brings.

Their New England family wishes them well.










And Pop has a 70th birthday party in New Hampshire.



As in Vermont, they love exploring their new state








They like visits with family, here...
